

CHAIN OF CUSTODY CERTIFICATION SCHEME.

Management policy

The management of Al Sindian paper Mill Co has chosen to use FSC certified products and sources in order to contribute to responsible forestry management.

An essential part of our choice is the Chain of Custody certification of our site. We state that we will follow the FSC international standards and guidelines. Our chain of custody certificate will provide a credible guarantee to our customers, whether business, government or end customer, that products which are sold (i.e. invoiced and possibly labelled) with a specified FSC certificate code are originating from well managed forests, controlled sources, reclaimed materials, or a mixture of these. FSC Chain of Custody certification thereby facilitates the transparent flow of goods made from such materials through the supply chain.

The NT operations director is responsible for the implementation of this policy. He has appointed the QC/QA manager as the management representative with overall responsibility and authority for the organization's compliance with all COC requirements as described in the standard. We describe our procedures in a manual. We will ensure that the written procedures are followed in order to avoid the mix of certified and non certified products during our processes.

This chain of custody certificate will not be the end of our efforts. We will actively encourage the use of FSC sources and maximize our portfolio of FSC certified products.

It is our policy, when we use the FSC policy for credit based claims; to avoid that in our products the following wood is used:

- 1) Wood that has been illegally harvested.
- 2) Wood harvested from areas being converted from forests and other wooded ecosystems to plantation or non-forest uses.
- 3) Wood from genetically modified trees.
- 4) Wood from areas where there is a clear demonstration of violation of traditional, customary or civil rights, or of serious extant disputes with indigenous peoples or other social stakeholders, involving confrontation or violence.
- 5) Wood from uncertified high conservation value forests.

As described in "FSC-Policy for Percentage-Based Claims".


We have developed internal verifiable procedures in order to ensure the tracing and control of our sources so that we are able to exclude non acceptable sources.

If it is demonstrated that a company is using wood from such sources, we will promptly take appropriate actions, including stopping purchases from such sources for products covered by this policy.

The company is committed to occupational health and safety.

The company is committed to not be directly or indirectly involved in the following activities:

- a) Illegal logging or the trade in illegal wood or forest products;
- b) Violation of traditional and human rights in forestry operations;
- c) Destruction of high conservation values in forestry operations;
- d) Significant conversion of forests to plantations or non-forest use;
- e) Introduction of genetically modified organisms in forestry operations;
- f) Violation of any of the ILO Core Conventions, as defined in the ILO Declaration on Fundamental Principles and Rights at Work, 1998.
